ORDER

- 1. WHEREAS, COVID19 has already been declared as a pandemic by the World Health Organization (WHO) and National Disaster Management Authority, being satisfied that the country is threatened with the COVID19 epidemic, has extended the lockdown in the entire country 30.06.2020 in Containment Zones and issued guidelines for phased reopening of prohibited activities of areas outside Containment Zones (Unlock 1).
- 2. WHEREAS, now, as per guidelines received from Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India (MHA, GoI) and Department of Home, Government of Punjab (DoH, GoP) certain directions need to be issued in supersession of previous orders.
- 3. THEREFORE, I, Girish Dayalan, IAS, District Magistrate, in exercise of powers conferred under Section 144 of Cr. PC hereby order the following with immediate effect:

I. Lockdown to continue in Containment Zones:

- i. Lockdown shall continue to remain in force in Containment Zones till 30.06.2020.
- ii. The Containment Zones and buffer zones will be as notified by the office of the undersigned.
- iii. In the Containment Zones, only essential activities shall be allowed. There shall be a strict perimeter control. Guidelines of State Health Dept and MoHFW in regard to activities in the Containment Zones shall be strictly followed.
- II. Guidelines for Areas Outside Containment Zones: In supersession of all the previous guidelines, the guidelines as under, would be applicable in the District during the period 01.06.2020 to 30.06.2020 outside the containment zones.
 - 1) Movement of persons Night curfew (9 pm to 5 am): The movement of individuals for all the non-essential activities shall remain prohibited between 9.00 pm to 5.00 am.
 - 2) **Protection of vulnerable persons:** The persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidity, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home except for essential requirements and/or health purposes.
 - 3) **National Directives:** The National Directives for Covid-19 Management as specified in Annexure-I to the guidelines of 30.05.2020 of the Ministry of Home, Government of India, shall be followed throughout the District.
 - 4) **Prohibited activities:** The following activities shall continue to be

prohibited:

- i. All cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- ii. All social, political, sports, entertainment, academic, cultural, religious functions and other large congregations.
- iii. Spitting in public places.
- iv. Consumption of liquor, pan, gutka, tobacco etc in public places is prohibited. However, there will be no restriction on their sale.
- v. Schools, colleges and other educational institutions and coaching institutes. *Online distance learning shall continue* to be permitted and shall be encouraged. These shall be opened as per the directions of MHA and GoP later.

5) Restricted activities:

- i. **Marriage related gatherings** Number of guests not to exceed 50.
- ii. Funeral/last rites Number of persons not to exceed 20.
- 6) The following will remain closed till 7/6/2020. However, these will be opened in compliance of the SoPs issued by the State Government:
 - i. Religious places/places of worship for public.
 - ii. Hotels and other hospitality services
 - iii. Shopping malls

7) Restaurants:

- i. may be opened for take-home or home delivery services; while home delivery may be allowed till 9 PM i.e. within permitted timings till movement of persons is allowed.
- ii. Dine-in services to remain closed till 7/6/2020 and will be opened as per the SoP issued by the State Government.
- 8) Inter-state movement of persons by domestic flights/ trains/ buses/ cars etc.: Inter-State movement of persons by domestic flights/trains/buses/cars etc. is allowed subject to the condition that the inward passengers would follow the SOP of the Health Department. The passengers would be required to either download Cova-app) and get self-generated 'e-pass' or declare their particulars at the airport/ railway station/ bus stand/ inter-state border as the case may be.

9) Movement of Buses and Vehicles:

- <u>Buses</u>: Inter-state and intra-state movement will be allowed subject to compliance of the SOP issued by the Transport Department, Punjab.
- ii. <u>Passenger vehicles</u>: Inter-state movement of passenger

vehicles like taxis, cabs, stage carriers, tempo-travellers and cars will be permitted against self-generated e-pass after downloading of COVA App or after declaring their particulars at the inter-state border. Intra-state shall be allowed without any restriction.

- iii. <u>Bicycles</u>, <u>rickshaws and auto-rickshaws</u>: will be allowed subject to compliance of the SOP as issued by the Transport Department, Punjab.
- iv. <u>2-wheelers</u>: will be allowed subject to compliance of the SOP as issued by the Transport Department, Punjab for 1+1 passengers.
- v. <u>4-wheelers:</u> will be allowed for 1+ 2 passengers subject to compliance of the SOP as issued by the Transport Department, Punjab. No pass would be required for permitted activities like shopping, going to office and workplace.
- vi. <u>Inter-State movement of goods:</u> There would be no restrictions on Inter-State movement of goods.
- vii. Social visits: Social visits (non-essential) shall be avoided.

10) Opening of Shops:

- i. All shops including shops in main bazars in both urban and rural areas allowed to open from 7 AM to 7 PM.
- ii. Liquor vends shall, however, remain open from 8 AM to 8 PM.
- iii. Barber shops, hair-cut saloons, beauty parlours and Spas will be allowed from 7 AM to 7 PM subject to compliance of the SOP as issued by the Health Department, Punjab.
- 11) **Sports complexes and stadia:** will be allowed without spectators as per the SOP of the Health Department.
- 12) **Industries and industrial establishments:** All categories of industries are allowed to operate in both rural and urban areas.
- 13) Construction activities: are allowed without any restriction in both the Urban and rural areas.
- 14) Agricultural, horticultural, animal husbandry, veterinary services are allowed without any restriction.
- 15) **Banks** may operate during their normal working hours without any restrictions.
- 16) **E-Commerce:** are permitted for all goods.

17) Offices:

i. Private Offices: allowed to open as per required strength without any restrictions except that compliance of social distancing and wearing of masks at all times, shall be ensured. If so required, the timings may be adjusted by the Heads of Offices to work in small teams to ensure strict

compliance of these restrictions.

ii. Government Offices:

- All Government offices would remain open as per required strength. However, Head of the Office will ensure that there is adequate space for maintaining social distancing norms. If the space is inadequate, the employees will be required to attend office by rotation.
- Further, those officers/employees assigned specific COVID19
 related duties by this office, shall continue to work on their
 respective duties and shall not be recalled until specifically
 relieved. The Heads of Offices in the District shall ensure
 compliance of the same and exempt such employees from their
 internal roster. Violation shall invite action against the
 employee and Head of Office as per law.
- 18) Social distancing and wearing of masks: Social distancing i.e. minimum 6 feet distance for all the activities shall always be maintained. Wearing of masks by all persons in public places including work-places etc. will be mandatory and must be strictly observed and enforced.

19) Permits and passes:

- i. No separate permission would be required by the industries and other establishments to resume their operations. All employees, be it government offices, private offices and other work-places, would be allowed to move without any requirement of pass during the permitted hours i.e. 5.00 am to 9.00 pm.
- ii. There shall be no restriction on inter-state movement of persons and no separate permission or E- permit would be required for such movement. However, use of cova-app and self-generated 'epass' would be mandatory.
- 20) Use of Arogaya Setu: Employees are advised to ensure that Arogaya Setu is installed by all the employees having compatible mobile phones. Similarly, individuals are also to be advised by the district authorities to install *Arogaya Setu* application on their compatible mobile phones and also regularly update their health status on the app.
- Penal provisions: Any violation of these guidelines and lockdown measures shall be punishable under sections 51 to 60 of the Disaster management Act, 2005 besides legal action under section 188 of Indian Penal Code (IPC).
- 22) Advisories: The Health & Family Welfare Department, Punjab has issued advisories on different subjects. All concerned are shall ensure compliance of these advisories.

4. Any violations shall invite criminal proceedings under the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and the Indian Penal Code, 1860.
